

# TACTICAL PRONE MATCH

SATURDAY JUNE 17TH FROM 8AM-1PM

## Match Format:

This is "fun match," we strictly follow all safety rules, we are very flexible regarding equipment and rifle rules. Match winner has bragging rights!

NRA slow fire format, single load, 15 shots for record in 15 minutes, 3 sighting shots will be allowed, all fired from the 100 yard line. Registration begins at 8:00AM, firing will begin promptly at 9:00AM.

## Safety:

Remove your rifle from the case on the firing line with the muzzle pointed down range. An empty chamber indicator (ECI) must be inserted when the range is "cold." Please ask for an ECI if you do not own one. Your muzzle must be pointed at the berm while closing the bolt on a live round. Slam fires do occur, and we cannot have any projectiles leaving the range.

## Registration:

Pre-registration not required but encouraged, \$5 per member, \$7 non-member. If you purchase a raffle ticket at the match your entry fee will be waived. Exact cash is appreciated. ## PRONE TACTICAL RIFLE, GEAR AND RULES

### History:

NRA Mid-Range Prone Tactical Rifle was developed about 7 years ago as discipline that will allow competitors to shoot rifles they already own without spending a lot of money on discipline specific equipment. Both "sling" and tactical rifle shooters will shoot alongside of each other. This match is ideally fired at 300, 500 and 600 yds, most clubs do not have a 600 yd range, so we shoot targets at 100 yds that are geometrically equivalent to the 600 yd target. We will also shoot 200yd matches in the. See a copy of NRA High Power Rifle Rules for more information on equipment and match format. The rules for equipment are a basic guideline only, we would like to come out and shoot.

### Rifles:

This was a discipline designed to be tactical in nature using AR-15 and AR-10 type rifles. We will also allow M1 and M1A rifles. A Harris type bipod or range bag/ruck sack can be used as a front rest. The intent is to shoot what you have. A soft rear rest is allowed. No stocks with an extension that rest on the ground are allowed. Suppressors and muzzle breaks are allowed. If you have a muzzle break, we will squad you on the final relay or next to some who is comfortable shooting next to you. Please be aware that muzzle breaks are typically not allowed in this type of event.

**Sights:**

Metallic, telescopic, red dot or holographic sights are allowed. Scopes are not limited in power. Red dot and holographic scopes are welcome.

**Other Gear/Accoutrements:**

- Shooting mats: A piece of carpeting or a commercial shooting mat is all that is needed. We will have carpeting available. Some find elbow pads useful. A shooting mat that secures the feet of the bipod is not allowed.
- Ear protection is required
- Eye protection is required
- Sweat band or towel can be useful when it is warm out
- 10, 20 or 30 round magazines
- Spotting scope and stand. We will have scopes available if you do not own one.
- Ammo
- Water
- We have a rifle and ammo available if you do not own one. Please notify me in advance if you need a rifle or ammo.
